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In Loving Memory of Dr. Marion Koerper



On Wednesday, December 18th, we lost Dr. Marion Koerper UCSF Hemophilia Treatment Center. Her years of involvement with the bleeding disorders has made a huge impact and helped provide many opportunities for community members. Her Dedication and Compassion Will Forever Inspire Us

Dr. Marion Koerper passed away early Wednesday morning, December 18, 2024, after a courageous battle with glioblastoma. A dedicated physician and educator, Dr. Koerper completed her undergraduate studies at Stanford University and earned her medical degree from the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF), where she met her future husband Dr. Bob Blumberg. She was a professor emerita (she would be pleased that I got the Latin correct) of pediatric hematology at the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF) and the founder of the UCSF Hemophilia Treatment Center.

Dr. Koerper was drawn to hematology and developed a profound interest in hemophilia. She worked alongside Dr. Shelby Dietrich, who pioneered the use of team-based meetings to provide comprehensive care at hemophilia clinics. Throughout her career, Dr. Koerper collaborated closely with the National Hemophilia Foundation and the World Federation of Hemophilia on global initiatives to improve care for people with bleeding disorders. Dr. Koerper was involved in many research projects and was widely published:

<u>https://profiles.ucsf.edu/marion.koerper</u>. She was a passionate advocate for her patients and a leader in advancing treatment options worldwide.

Dr. Koerper served as a medical advisor, president, and board member for the Hemophilia Foundation of Northern California (HFNC). Dr. Koerper and Susan Karp, RN created a summer camp for children with hemophilia in 1978, which eventually became Camp Hemotion. For over 30 years, she staffed the camp's infirmary, ensuring that campers received exceptional care and enjoyed a safe and enriching experience. Her dedication extended beyond medicine to mentorship; her wisdom and compassion left an indelible mark on countless lives. If I had a child in my cabin that didn't want to swim, I'd send him down to the infirmary, saying "If Dr. K says you can't swim, you don't have to swim. Otherwise, you're going into the pool".

Dr. Koerper played a pivotal role during the AIDS epidemic, which devastated the hemophilia community in the 1980s. Her resilience and leadership were unwavering as she guided patients, families, and colleagues through one of the darkest chapters in medical history. The epidemic's toll on her patients was deeply personal, yet she continued to fight for better treatments and support systems, even stepping in to lead the HFNC during this challenging time.

Dr. Koerper's contributions to the field were recognized on a national and international scale. She received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the National Hemophilia Foundation and was revered wherever she went. Her legacy is one of compassion, innovation, and dedication to improving the lives of those with bleeding disorders.

Services for Dr. Marion Koerper was held on Friday, December 20, 2024, at 1:00 PM in the chapel at Home of Peace Cemetery, 1299 El Camino Real, Colma, California. She is survived by her husband, Dr. Bob Blumberg, their two sons, and two grandsons. As we remember Dr. Koerper's monumental contributions to the hemophilia community, let us celebrate her extraordinary life and enduring legacy.

2024 Unite Walk Wrap Up



This year, we were one of 37 national walks that took place around the country, totaling over 5,697 participants and \$1.9 million raised.

For our personal walk this year, we finished with 16 teams and 70 registered participants bringing in \$13,820. We had a great turnout with our actual in-person event with entertainment by Andrew Aragon, games, activities, and snacks.

We had a great opportunity to work with Hiki No Tent Rental, a local family business, who gave us a great rate on our tent rentals for 2024 Unite Walk. What used to cost us over \$3,000, we got from Hiki No for just over \$1,000. Unfortunately, their family is moving to the mainland and will no longer be continuing their business so if anyone has any tent rental companies you'd like to suggest, please reach out!

Tahoe Pieklo led us through our Pinwheel Ceremony before we took our lap around Kapi`olani Park. After that, participants had the opportunity to look around at our sponsors booths, as well as get their face painted by artists from Storybook Entertainment.

We also had a remote walk on Maui, organized by the Hu`eu Ohana and sponsored in part by Octapharma. During the day of their walk celebration, they were able to bring in over \$1000 just from family and friends attending their event!!

We had 4 factor club winners during the time of our walk, but we have been doing so great with continued fundraising that we had someone else since join our Factor Club Group! Those who fundraised a certain amount had a choice between two different prizes this year instead of having a set prize. I thought that made it a lot more interesting and exciting to have the power to make that type on decision.

Event Changes & Expectations

Some things have changed regarding event registration. After discussing with our December Voices attendees, we have decided to let O`ahu families opt out of staying in a hotel. You still have the option to stay if you would like, but if you are fine with staying at your house and driving over, we would offer you a gas card in return (amount will depend on mileage between house and venue).

We will also be asking on island families if they want to drive to/from meeting space (if it is different from hotel space) and we would cover that parking cost. This would help us cut down on purchasing larger transportation like a big tour bus. The price of meals through hotels are also skyrocketing so we are also looking at alternative food options like bentos vs buffets through the hotel.

As an attendee, we do expect you to be at the event for the whole duration of program. This includes participating in conversation, activities, and being a good role model to the kids to engage. There have been multiple times in the past where I have seen people try and sneak off to go shopping, take naps, etc during program time and that will no longer be tolerated.
